From the Rector's desk:

As we settle back into the routine of our daily lives following, I hope, an enjoyable and relaxing Summer, soon we will be extremely busy again with many demands on our time and energy. It might make sense for us to think ahead, and, determine how we are going to utilize our time so that we get the maximum results and satisfaction. This exercise might also be a good one for our children, because young people today live very busy lives as well, and have so much to offer when they can find the right balance in their lives. I would like for everyone to include in their daily routine time for spiritual renewal as well. It's not something we necessarily think about when we are planning our day – how much time will I devote to prayer today? What verses of scripture will I read and think about today? Will I take a few minutes today to meditate? Research shows that when Christians (and other faith adherents) take the time to focus on God in the course of their day then their work is more rewarding and their stress is much less. As baptized Christians having prayer and silent meditation in our lives should be as natural as breathing. If it is not than how do we practice it so that it becomes part of who we are? Again, the world is a busy place, we all live busy lives, but as the old adage says – "when we are too busy to pray then is the time we really need to pray". God has an expectation that we will be people of faith and that we will nurture our relationship with God. In the gospel reading today (Luke 14: 25-33) Jesus really drives home the point in a seemingly harsh

manner. He says – whoever does not hate father, mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. These are strong words, and, taken literally seems a contradiction to Jesus' overall message of love. What we must understand from these words is that sometimes other things can get in the way of our relationship with Jesus, and cause us to miss out on the blessings that come from a healthy relationship. Jesus loved his earthly parents, Mary and Joseph, and from what we know in scripture he was an obedient son, even as he hung on the cross his concern was for his mother. Jesus does not want us to hate anyone, quite to the contrary, he uses these strong words to show us that there is a cost to discipleship, and to be in relationship with him may require sacrificing other things in life that stand in opposition to his message. Being a disciple of Jesus means we have to take stock of our spiritual lives daily and put our priorities in order so that we are not missing out on the blessings that come from a deep relationship with him. May we seek out ways to ensure that prayer, bible study and worship remain a top priority in our lives even in the midst of busyness and chaos all around us.
