## From the Rector's Desk

In May, 2016, we had Shawn Branch visiting our parish for a teaching mission. Shawn is the director for Threshold Ministries in Canada, which once known as the "Church Army in Canada". A large number of Newfoundlanders were trained for ministry in the Church Army, people like Archdeacon John Sharpe and myself.

Threshold Ministry is an evangelical ministry within the Anglican Church of Canada. Many evangelists are serving different ministries across our country. They are helping people to know Jesus and transforming lives and communities where they serve. They are serving communities in need through food banks, street outreach, prison chaplaincy, ex-offender care and support, helping women involved in prostitution, self - harm prevention, youth outreach, church planting, fresh expression, training evangelists, providing workshops and resources to churches and parish groups, mission work, etc. These are just a small number of ministries that is carried out by Threshold Ministries in Canada and around the world.

As a member with Threshold Ministries, I am asked once in a while to share their work with other people. Today, many evangelists are preaching and telling about the work of Threshold Ministries from coast to coast, as they have taken Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> to share their ministry with others.

## A note from The Anglican Chaplaincy:
