From the Rector's desk:

The Day of Pentecost is considered, by many Christian traditions, to be the birthday of the Church. Natural phenomena that we fear most in the world, fire, lightning, hurricane, earthquake, thunder, things often associated with disaster, are used in the bible to describe the manifestations of God. Biblical authors often used these images to present the outpouring of God's Spirit upon individuals and nations. These strong winds, outburst of thunder and lightning, and flames of fire signified great power and strength from on high, controlled by the God of creation, and beyond any human ability to control. Where the Spirit comes radical transformations occur, barriers are knocked down, locked doors are thrown wide-open, lives are changed and people touched by it are empowered to change the world. That's what we see in the story of Pentecost, the promised Holy Spirit that the apostles had been told to wait for in Jerusalem, has now arrived suddenly and powerfully. Lives are changed, former divisions based on language, race, creed or class is erased, and everyone is speaking in a language that, surprisingly, everyone understands, thanks to the power of the Holy Spirit. In that gathering

of people from every nation there is common unity, based on mutual love for the *One True God*. The realization now is that God is Lord of all nations, nobody has a monopoly on his love, that Jesus came to save all of humanity. How wonderful it would be in this modern age of separation, disunity and military aggression, if people could gather together from every corner of the world, and be filled with that same Spirit of Pentecost. Today is recognized as the birthday of the church, and, as you know, we only celebrate birthdays for the living, it's the celebration of life. That obviously means that the Church is still very much alive and well. That God's Holy Spirit is still moving among us, descending upon us over and over again in all kinds of ways. How can we, the people of the parish of St. Philip's, use this gift of the Holy Spirit to transform and change the world around us? When these early apostles, huddled together in one place, afraid of the world, received that gift of the Spirit, it empowered them to go out and proclaim the name of Christ. How can that same Spirit, that we have received, empower us to grow this church, and make a difference in our community and world?


