Today we celebrate the Feast of St. Philip, the Patron Saint for whom this church and community are named. We remember St. Philip as we come together in this service to celebrate the Holy Eucharist with Baptism. In this service, two children will become members of the Body of Christ – the Church. We welcome them into our midst with their families.

I would encourage the families to continue to share with us in worship after this baptismal

service. We have a person who looks after our nursery, therefore you can come with your children as they share in a program and be part of our worship. We would welcome you to be a part of our worshipping community and you would be able to call the Church of St. Philip your spiritual home.

The Apostle St. Philip was from Bethsaida on the Sea of Galilee. A day after Peter was called by Jesus to be a disciple, Jesus found Philip and said, "Follow me".

Philip was present at the miracle of the loaves and fishes and had a brief chat with Jesus. He was approached by the Hellenistic Jews from Bethsaida to introduce them to Jesus. Before the Passion, Jesus answered Philip's query to show them the Father. Little is known about Philip after this but it is believed that he was with the disciples when Jesus appeared to them in the upper room after his resurrection. It is believed that Philip was crucified.

Philip is the Patron Saint of hatters, pastry chefs, the nations of Luxembourg and Uruguay, many schools, churches and hospitals.

Today we give thanks to our Patron Saint, Philip, and may we be strengthened as we worship.
