Launching out into the Deep....Into New Spiritual Depths

From the Rector's Desk

The first precept highlighted in our Parish Mission Statement is this: **"To be fishers of people in response to the call of Jesus, in the Power of the Holy Spirit."** This is one important part of Mission in which we are challenged to give full attention and a fulsome response, here at St. Philip's.

It is human to resist something which makes no sense to us. After fishing all night and having caught nothing, Jesus told Peter to put out into the deep and to put down their nets. Peter was a professional fisherman. He knew all there was to know about fishing; and what Jesus asked him to do made no sense to him at all. We understand his protest. Yet Peter was obedient and did exactly as our Lord had told him. We often refer to the miracle of the abundant catch of fish. Another miracle of great importance is how Peter was caught by Jesus, how he was changed within himself and how his life and career would also be changed. Peter and his partners would remain as fishermen but as fishers of people; commissioned by our Lord to bring people into God's kingdom. And so are we!

The story begins with people pressing in on Jesus forcing him to the water's edge and having to get in a boat and to preach from there. The people hungered for the teaching that Jesus offered. They were like fish being drawn to the light or to living food. The world is still hungry to receive the Word of God and to experience God's love.

Jesus promised Peter that in the future he would catch people for the Kingdom. To catch fish requires dedication and faithfulness; and it also requires the Word of God which lures hungry people towards life with God. The world is full of people hungry for the love of God in Christ. It is, therefore, the business of every Christian disciple to make Christianity and God's Church attractive and wholesome; working with Jesus in his ministry of Kingdom building. A congregation was asked, how come their church was growing so rapidly. The reply was: "It is the quality of the life of our members that brings inquirers to attend church and eventually to become a part of it."

Our Lord came to the shore of Lake Gennesaret to fish for Peter and to call him into ministry. He came to a tax office to fish for and call Matthew. As it was then, so it is now; our Lord comes to ordinary people like you and me, on any ordinary day, in any ordinary way, to ordinary people occupied in ordinary tasks calling us into discipleship and into a vocation of fishing for people, of lovingly inviting people into friendship and into fellowship with Christ and his church and into His Kingdom of Love.

One more thing which is clear from our Lord's call to Peter and from our Lord's teaching and the claims he makes on His disciples, we either allow ourselves to be fully caught or to swim away. Being a lukewarm disciple is never enough in our Lord's eyes. In the Book of Revelation, our Lord reproves and disciplines those churches who are neither hot nor cold because complacency renders people ineffective and unattractive to others and unfaithful to our Lord's Mission.

A lack of enthusiasm will not generate enthusiasm. Anything that is great demands our best efforts, our dedication and commitment. A lukewarm, half-hearted fisherman fails in his occupation. A fully responsive and obedient fisherman like Peter moves from no fish to a very large catch, from defeat to victory. Remarkable things happened in Peter's life because he was fully committed and faithful to his calling to be a fisher of people. Rev.
