

For me, this is an exciting day as we gather to bless and dedicate these windows to the honor and glory of God in thanksgiving for the life and witness of those who have gone before us. It is a great joy to see the Memorial Garden come to fruition. It was the dream of our Vestry to have the columbaria installed and the grounds where the old St. Philip's Church once stood to be a "Memorial Garden of Peace". Today, we give thanks to God for the gifts received from the estates of the late Dr. Grace Layman and Louise Tremblett which have made it possible for this work to be done. If not today, gates will be erected later in their memory.

It is so important for people to think about leaving the church something in their wills. This church will be always grateful for these gifts.

We will, in the near future, be writing rules and regulations for the columbaria with the pricing. Since the columbaria have arrived this past week, we have had two inquiries.

I am so happy that the Cheeseman family has decided to use one of the niches for

the resting place for Canon Bert. He was the first rector of this parish when the parish was divided in 1986. It is only right that he be the first to be interred there.

My prayer and hope is that our "Garden of Peace" will truly be a place where we all can come and feel the presence of the Risen Lord.
