### **Stewardship thought For the Week**

There are two approaches to looking at the tasks of the church involving financing. 1) We could say, “How can we ever?” and be careful not to move too fast or reach too far; 2) We could say, “How can we not?” and launch out to do those things that will glorify the kingdom of God.

When a church becomes committed to what God wants, it seldom has to

retrench. Let's ask "Does God want it?" and if the answer is "Yes," let's do it.

**Maintenance Fund**: We are asking our parishioners to give monthly through the Maintenance Fund to help us lower our debt on the new furnace. We have borrowed the amount of \$50,000.00 from the Bank of Montreal. This loan is out for seven years. Beginning Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> 2016, we are paying **\$653.93** per month.

Proclaiming the good news of Jesus to all. We are his disciples in the world today and we have been commissioned to carry out his ministry like the disciples of old and to do even greater works. It was after the resurrection that the disciples came to understand the work they had been called to do. They

were to proclaim the gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ and the victory He brought to all. The members of the first church provided for one another; especially those in need (widows & orphans). Are we, as a church, doing this?

Jesus is calling us now to be faithful followers of Him and He will equip us for the work He is calling us to do. Let us strive and live what we proclaim, so that Christ might be seen and known in the world in which we live.

If we are preaching to the converted, then it is time to get on with the work that we have been called to do. To know Christ and make Him known.
