From the Rector's desk:

It gives me great joy to wish each and every one of you a very Happy, Healthy and Prosperous New Year. Tomorrow, January 6th, brings to a close another Christmas season, the tree and decorations will be stored away, and we will return to the ordinary and routine of our daily lives. This year, 2020, is the beginning of another decade, hard to imagine that the anxiety many experienced at the turn of 2000 is now 20 years behind us. In those 20 years we have all experienced many changes in our lives, children and grandchildren have been born, children have been raised and are now making their own mark on the world, some of us have retired, some have changed professions, there have been joyous occasions such as weddings, and there have been sad moments when we lost loved ones, and the list goes on and on. Point is our lives never remain the same, we are constantly going through change, much of which we embrace and some we refuse to accept, but none-the-less happens anyhow. We never know what lies around the corner for any of us, but we do know that the one thing that never changes is God's love for us. The Church too has experienced much change in these past two decades and even much before that. There has been much focus in our own diocese in the past two years around *mission*, much of it as a reaction to a steady decline in parish membership in almost every area of our diocese, and, indeed across the whole of Canada and North America. It is estimated, based on statistics, that in the next 25 years many churches will cease to exist unless we can find ways to connect with the world around us. I hope and pray that our parish will be one that can buck this trend. Our new Primate, Archbishop Linda Nichols, as well as our own diocesan bishop, is calling on Anglicans in every congregation and parish in Canada to share in the vision, life and ministry of our church. Let me quote some parts of a letter from the office of the General Secretary of the Anglican Church of Canada.

Newly released statistics about membership in the Anglican Church of Canada—like that of other national religious organizations—confirm that the church has experienced continuous decline in its membership base since the early 1960s in spite of strategies for growth and engagement. The data in hand call for serious attention. At the same time, they do not provide a full scan of the vitality of our church. The availability of this data, and the work of developing supplementary data, is timely, as our church undertakes a national strategic planning process to consider the shape of its future ministry. There is considerable evidence that, while participation in the range of activities (Sunday worship as part of the church, financial support for the church, membership in the church organization) is in steady decline, there remains a hunger for spiritual depth and purpose among many Canadians. As the church grows in understanding the current shape and focus of that hunger, we will be in a position to make decisions about how to offer the spiritual traditions of which we are stewards. The reduction of the size of the church, as measured by participation in worship, financial support, and formal membership, is one of many ways in which the church is changing. A smaller and more focused church may, at the same time, search out ways to be more effective in addressing God's call for justice, reconciliation and hope. Our new Primate is committed to devoting the significant time needed to determine how best to align the structures and operations of the church with its mission and purpose. This work will require innovative, collaborative and prayerful discussions with dioceses and across the church's incredible geographic, cultural and theological diversity—all with the goal and hope of preparing the church for ministry in the years to come.

We have the tools and resources in our parish that are necessary to our growth and vitality as a parish, but we will need to find meaningful ways to engage them in the work that God calls us to. I hope that 2020 will see a resurgence of energy and commitment to God's call to ministry in St. Philip's, so that over the next two decades we don't end up as one of the statistics of closed churches in Canada.
