Message from the Rector

As you read this reflection, we have just passed the first Sunday of Advent about to embrace the second Sunday of Advent, which will be the middle of the Advent season. Christmas is now coming at lightning speed. Advent is a time for us to think about the birth of Jesus into the world as a baby over 2000 years ago; however, Advent is about much more than reminiscing about an event that happened a long time ago. Advent is also a reminder for us to be awake, to be alert, to live our lives in a mode of anticipation of what is to come. Jesus promised that at some point in the future he would return again. So, Advent is a time to be reminded of Jesus' birth into the world, but also to look forward to that day when he will return again in great glory and triumph to judge the world and to redeem his people. As we heard from the gospel of Matthew last Sunday (Nov. 30th Advent 1), about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only God. Two will be in the field, one will be taken and one left, two women will be grinding meal together, one will be taken the other left...keep awake therefore, for you do not know which day the Lord is coming...therefore you must be ready for the son of man is coming at an unexpected hour. The second Sunday of Advent will include another gospel reading from Matthew recounting the story of John the Baptist going ahead of Jesus to prepare the people for his coming into the world, and challenging them to change their ways so as to be found acceptable to the Lord when he comes. God had grown tired of sending the Old Testament prophets to teach them the ways of justice and righteousness, only for the prophets to be met with rejection, ridicule, violence and death. Now God was coming directly in the form of Jesus Christ (Incarnation) to live among us as one of us, to show us the way to live. It is common for some preachers and churches to predict the return of Christ, and they sometimes succeed in instilling fear in people. It's never God's intent to bring us to faith by fear and doom. The Advent season resonates joy and anticipation, because it

tells a beautiful story of God's love for humanity, and God's profound desire that we come to faith, so that we can experience all the good things that come from living in the iov of the Lord. Predictions over the last 2000 years about the end of the world has never been more than foolishness, because as we read earlier, about that day or hour no one knows...only God. To put forward these kinds of claims is contrary to scripture, and does not proclaim a God of love but rather a God of doom and gloom, which God is not. We are never going to live on this earth forever, so we live each day as if God will call us home that day, never fearing to meet our Lord. Instead of dwelling on the end of the world, let us dwell on God, who loves us with an infinite love, and spared nothing to redeem us, even by sending God's only son, Jesus Christ, to lead us. Advent and Christmas are about light and love and life. It is an opportunity for humanity to be reminded once more of God's deep desire for us to live in the world. I think we live in a very critical time in history, there is a lot amuck in our world, and God is calling us as individuals of faith, and collectively as the Church to pull together, so that we can be all that God wants us to be in our calling to be bearers of light, love and hope in this dark world. As Advent continues for a few weeks, may we take the opportunity to draw closer to our Lord. We live in a chaotic world, perhaps something like the world in which Jesus was born into in Bethlehem so long ago. We have war and violence, people live in fear, many have abandoned the faith altogether. maybe we need to catch a fresh glimpse of the baby Jesus coming anew this Christmas, with the same promise of hope and redemption and new life. Take time to reflect on the themes of Advent - hope, peace, joy and love, and remember they are still very much pillars of our faith. I hope you can join us each week for our Advent journey, and for the great celebration of Christmas.

A cabinet maker has taken measurements for a countertop and storage areas in the rear. These people are offering their services at no charge. It is our hope to have the vehicle on the road before the winter season. We continue to gratefully receive financial donations from parishes and individuals.
