Message from the Rector: From the Rector's desk: In the business of life, sometimes it's difficult to find the time and space we need to be with God for the renewal of our spiritual lives. The easiest thing in the world to do is neglect our relationship with God. Our lives become busy and often we become too busy to pray and worship. The Summer season is perhaps the easiest time to become disconnected if we aren't careful, things come to a close at church, except for the Sunday morning worship, we go on vacation, and, it's not always easy to find a church where we can attend conveniently. We don't plan to let our prayer and worship lives slip, it just happens, and it happens to us all. If your travels this Summer have been taking you away from your home church, I encourage you to take advantage of that absence to search out other churches where you happen to be, I'm sure it can be a very meaningful experience, for God is very much present there also. God desires nothing more than for us to be in his presence daily, and wherever that might be. There are billions of people on this planet, and, God delights in each one of us in a personal way. I like this quote from Augustine – <i>"God loves each of us as if there were only one of us"</i>. As another Summer begins to wind down, I hope it continues to be a wonderful time of both physical and spiritual renewal, for we need that time to gather strength and enthusiasm for what God calls us to be and to do in his service. It is our hope that this endeavor will provide a space for those living on the streets to get warm in the winter, cooled in the summer, to provide a simple hot meal, coffee & tea or a cold drink, and provide basic clothing and hygiene & toiletry items.
