From the Rector's Desk

I want to share with you a matter which arose during this week.

I received a call from the funeral home regarding a death. The service was going to be held at the funeral home by another priest and they were seeking permission for him to come to our cemetery to do the burial. The reason given is my stand on the former church and the dislike they had for me.

You must remember that I had never met or spoken to the people making this request; they are not members of the church and therefore their gift of stewardship had not been shown.

I declined to have that priest come into the Parish for the burial. The policy from this point onward and as long as I am Rector here is that such reasons given will not be sufficient for other clergy to come in and do burials or any Sacraments.

If someone is going to be buried in this cemetery, it will be the Rector of this Parish or one of his Honorary Assistants, whom the Rector will ask.

I would ask that this be respected by the Clergy and members of the congregation.

Today is the last day in the Parish for Father Anthony. It has been a joy having him with us and conducting the teaching mission. We wish him a safe trip back to Belize and to his people. Our prayers go with him and with the people of St. Mark's.

I hope this experience will be ongoing in the Parish over the next few years, so we can grow spiritually and see God's blessing on us more and more. Thank you, Father Anthony, for being with us and for the joy you brought among us. The people of St. Mark's and you will be in our prayers. Thank you for your friendship.

If anyone has a suggestion for a speaker for our mission in 2016, please let me know.

Thank you all for being a part of the ministry which took place at St. Philip's this past week.

I want to thank the members of Vestry and Church for the wonderful job they did last Monday night. They came together to clean up the cemetery. There were about 50 garbage bags filled

with old plastic containers and artificial flowers which had been thrown over the fence over the years.

We want to encourage our Church members to bring a garbage bag with them when cleaning up the graves and take it home instead of throwing things over the fence. Thank you.

Chaplaincy Services at Hospitals in St. John's

When you are being admitted to a hospital in St. John's, you should be asked, "While you are admitted to hospital, would you like to have a visit from a chaplain or pastoral care worker?" Be sure to say "Yes" if you would like a pastoral visit. You will then be asked to identify your religion, and your name will be added to the chaplain's visitation list, and you will then receive a visit from the denominational chaplain within a day or two.

Also, the Anglican, Roman Catholic, Salvation Army and United Church Chaplaincy Teams are continuing a pilot project to assess ways to share resources. The four denominations will share First-call Chaplain responsibilities at the hospitals in St. John's. This means that each night one chaplain will receive all after-hours calls (5:00 pm to 8:00 am). That First-call Chaplain will determine

if the chaplain from the patient's own denomination is needed to provide particular services or supports (anointing/ communion). Patients and families can request their denominational chaplain, if they so wish. The denominational chaplains will follow up with patients seen by the First-call Chaplain.
