PHILIP'S CHURCH.</p> <p><i>Message from the Rector</i></p> <p>How quickly the years seem to pass, it's hard to believe that we are now into 2026. As we begin to make our way through this new year, we don't know what lies before us, all we know is that God is with us, both in times of joy and sorrow. It was a marvelous thing again this Christmas, to be able to come together in a spirit of joy to celebrate God's greatest gift to our world, the gift of Jesus Christ, born in human flesh, but God incarnate. Christmas sets the mood of optimism and hope, we have for the new year, that no matter what comes our way, we are never alone. Christians, by virtue of who we are, are not meant to live apart from other Christians. We belong to a much larger family, the family of God, and coming together on Christmas Eve as families, and the wider family of God on Christmas Eve, lets us know that we are there for one another. Think about Christmas, how excited we are when family members living away, perhaps we haven't seen them in a long time, finally make it home for Christmas. It really brings the home alive and lifts our spirits. That's how we should be in our churchfamily as well, we should be very excited when those we haven't seen for a while returns to the family gathering. The price of them remains the same as past years at \$8.00 each.</p>	<p>Mobile Ministry Bus Update. St. Philip's first donation of items for the diocesan bus ministry was taken to Church House over Christmas. Dawn Cheeseman collected the items from our parishioners, organized them in boxes, labelled the boxes, and Rev. Randy took them to Church House. There was a substantial number of knitted items, and our synod office staff were thrilled to receive such a generous contribution. Dawn is still collecting items, so if you wish to continue contributing items for the bus, please drop them to the church.</p> <p>The diocese has physical possession of the 12-passenger bus from Metrobus. It is currently at a garage awaiting Motor Vehicle Inspection and several upgrades & modifications which should be completed within the next few weeks. A cabinet maker has taken measurements for a countertop and storage areas in the rear. These people are offering their services at no charge. It is our hope to have the vehicle on the road before the winter season. We continue to gratefully receive financial donations from parishes and individuals. Anyone wishing to offer a financial donation may make it to "Mobile Ministry Bus" and send it to 22 Church Hill, St. John's, NL A1C 3Z9. Receipts will be issued for tax purposes. Given the current postal strike, donations can be made by credit card by contacting Rev. Fred Marshall @ 709-727-4346. Within the next 3 - 4 weeks we will be looking for volunteers (drivers and host/hostess, meal providers and others) to help operate this important ministry. In addition, it is hoped to establish a committee to oversee scheduling and operations.
