A WARM WELCOME IS EXTENDED TO ALL OUR PARISHIONERS AND VISITORS WHO ARE WITH US TODAY. WE HOPE THAT GOD WILL BLESS US AS WE WORSHIP HIM HERE TOGETHER AT ST. PHILIP'S CHURCH.

From the Rector's desk: Today finds us at the mid-way point of Lent, and, perhaps a time to reflect on our Lenten journey. Three weeks from now we will arrive at Palm Sunday, and, the beginning of another journey through Holy Week. Lent provides us with an opportunity to walk with Jesus through his wilderness experience, a lonely and solitude time as he faced the temptations of Satan to forsake God and follow the prince of darkness and evil. It was truly an experience that tested Jesus' humanity and his resolve to follow the path that God had set him on. Satan tried to take advantage of Jesus' human weakness, especially his need for food and water, the sustenance of life itself, but Jesus did not falter, he met every temptation head on, and sent Satan away defeated. Jesus knew he was the Son of God, sent into the world to bring light, peace and hope to humanity. In the wilderness he found strength to face what lay before him, especially all that was waiting for him in Jerusalem. Lent is also our time to draw near to God, to take stock of our lives, and to see what we need to do to prepare for Easter. The world today is a busy place, our lives are busy, and its easy to be distracted

from what is ultimately most important. If we are not careful we can easily take our eyes off Jesus and falter. We are currently doing a bible study each Wednesday night based on the book titled *If You Want To Walk On Water You have To Get Out Of The Boat*, by John Ortberg. The book looks at Peter's experience of being in a storm on the lake with the other disciples, they see what appears to be Jesus walking on the water, Peter jumps out of the boat and finds himself walking to Jesus on the water. Then he takes his eyes off Jesus and begins to sink, fear takes over and Jesus reaches out and saves him. Peter was fine as long as Jesus was his focus. True with our lives as well, when we take our eyes off Jesus our lives can quickly unravel, and there are many things in the world that can cause us to lose focus and begin to sink. Lent is a time to refocus, to really come close to Jesus, and help prepare us for the great celebration of Easter. Before Easter we have three more weeks of Lent, then Holy Week, to journey with Jesus through the Last Supper, his arrest, trial and crucifixion. Only as we gather at the cross of Good Friday can we be at the empty tomb of Easter Sunday. I invite you to continue your journey with us, so that Easter will be truly a celebration of joy and hope in the resurrected Christ, that brings us salvation and eternal life.
