A WARM WELCOME IS EXTENDED TO ALL OUR PARISHIONERS AND VISITORS WHO ARE WITH US TODAY. WE HOPE THAT GOD WILL BLESS US AS WE WORSHIP HIM HERE TOGETHER AT ST. PHILIP'S CHURCH.

From the Rector's desk: We are now just three days from the start of Lent, and, a journey that we are embarking upon that will take us through Jesus' wilderness experience, his temptations at his weakest moments, the last supper with the disciples, his arrest, trial, crucifixion, and resurrection on Easter morning. There's a lot to do before the great celebration of Easter. You and I are in the unique situation of knowing how the story ended, but, for the family of Jesus, his disciples and followers, they were caught up in something that they were not sure how it would end. Just imagine when he hung upon the cross and breathed his last, it must have been hard for those around the cross, or watching from a distance, to find much cause for hope. The journey we re-enact through Lent and Holy Week was a lonely and difficult one for Jesus, in his humanity there was a sense of abandonment by those close to him and even by God his Father. Yet, at the same time there was a deep sense of trust that his Father was the divine author of a great plan to save humanity, and to restore hope to a world of despair. It was pure and unimaginable love that sustained Jesus in those darkest moments of his life and death. Because we are in the position of knowing how the story ended, we can be ever so thankful for his sacrifice, and feel the depth of God's great love for us. In the gospel we read today is that

beautiful story of a desperate leper falling down and begging Jesus to heal him, what a brave fellow, because in those days lepers were forbidden to approach anyone in society, they were outcasts in every sense of the word. Jesus did not recoil or find the man repulsive, he simply reached out and touched the man and healed him. This was Jesus' reaction to those who came to him. Now the man healed did not obey Jesus by keeping quiet about it, but went and told everyone, which made it difficult for Jesus to enter towns without being overwhelmed by people in need. I think the reaction of the man was a natural one, its hard to keep quiet about such a life changing miracle. During this Lent, think about the times in your life where something marvelous happened that turned your despair into hope, that turned your sickness into wholeness of health, and, be like that leper, go and spread the news. In this case I think Jesus would be pleased for us to tell it. We have such a marvelous story to tell the world, but, before we can tell it to others we must acknowledge it in our own lives, and be grateful to God for his goodness. May this Lent be a time for reflection and renewal, and a time to boldly declare God's love in our lives.




