From the Rector's desk: Today (September 29<sup>th</sup>) is one of the Sundays when we celebrate a Saint, and, in this case it is St. Michael. More than that, we also celebrate "All Angels". Very little is known about St Michael other than what we know from scriptures, which themselves are sparse. In Daniel, St. Michael is mentioned twice. The first time as one who helped Daniel, and the second time he is mentioned with regard to the end times of the world when he will stand for the "children of thy people." His next mention comes in the Epistle of St. Jude, where St. Michael is said to guard the tombs of Moses and Eve and has contended with Satan over the body of Moses. The final mention is in Revelation, where St. Michael and his angels, do battle with the dragon (Satan). Saint Michael the Archangel isn't just a saint, but rather he is also an angel, and the leader of all angels and of the army of God. This is what the title "Archangel" means, that he is above all the others in rank. St. Michael has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition.

- The first is to combat Satan.
- The second is to escort the faithful to heaven at their hour of death.
- The third is to be a champion of all Christians, and the Church itself.
- And the fourth is to call humanity from life on Earth to their heavenly judgment.

Today, St. Michael is invoked for protection, especially from dangerous enemies. He is also the patron of grocers, mariners, soldiers, police and doctors. The Church recognizes that saints and angels are still among us, that they are still the messengers of God's will, and, are protectors of God's people. Within Anglicanism we have many congregations named after St. Michael & All Angels, which supports the belief that, in many ways, both the Church and Christians are always under attack by Satan, and, we need God's protection from the whole heavenly hosts of Angels. Many Christians have all kinds of ideas and beliefs around saints and Angels, some dismiss it altogether, however, we cannot deny the reality of their importance in both the Old & New Testaments, as God constantly sent them back and forth between God and human beings. If we believe in the presence of Angels in our lives, those sent by God to protect us and watch over us, then there is certainly great need for them in our present world. Evil comes in all forms and sometimes disguised as seemingly innocent, however, we know that the power of evil is as great now as ever it was since creation. I, for one, take great comfort in knowing that God still has a need and use for Angels among us. So, today we remember and commemorate St. Michael & All Angels, not as a fable of the Church and history, but as everlasting messengers and protectors of God people in a dangerous world.
