From the Rector's Desk

The conversion of St. Paul, which we celebrated on Wednesday, Jan. 25th is one of my favorite minor feast days in the life of the church.

The Acts of the Apostles records, for us, this conversion. (Acts 26: 9 – 23). St. Paul was known as Saul, who went to Jerusalem for letters from the authority to put to death people who

claimed to be followers of Jesus Christ.

While travelling to Damascus to rid the city of any Christian thoughts or ideals, Saul and those with him saw a great light from heaven and they fell off their horses. Saul heard a voice speaking to him. "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?"

There is a conversation going on between Jesus and Saul as Jesus lays out to Saul the work that He is giving him to do. Saul then becomes Paul and begins to work for the extension of the church in the world in which he lived at that time. We are told that people repented and numbers were added to the church.

What we see here is a person who had his life changed forever.

This fellow wanted to get rid of this new found religion, put it down before it got started, but instead became one of the great leaders in the church.

MAINTENANCE FUND: We are asking our parishioners to give monthly through the Maintenance Fund to help us lower our debt on the new furnace. We have borrowed the amount of \$50,000.00 from the Bank of Montreal. This loan is out for seven years. Beginning Dec. 31st 2016, we are paying **\$653.93** per month.
