Happy Canada Day (July 1st) As our nation celebrates 151 years. We have much to be thankful for living in a rich and prosperous country, and, to be blessed with what we enjoy as citizens. Today also happen to be *Memorial Day* in our province, a time for us to be thankful for the sacrifice of men and women who have died while protecting the freedoms we have as Canadians, especially during the first world war. Memorial Day commemorates Newfoundland and Labrador's veterans, especially the members of the Newfoundland Regiment who fought and died at Beaumont Hamel during the opening day of the Battle of the Somme on July 1, 1916. There will be a memorial service at the local legion today that Rev. Randy will be sharing in.
