**From the Rector's desk:**

Our Church calendar year is really interesting, as we move from season to season and feast to feast. It begins with Advent and moves to Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, Pentecost, Trinity and then back to Advent again. In all of that we commemorate all kinds of Feast Days, including Saints days. As we go from Advent to Advent, we come full circle with our church year. Today, we begin the longest season of the church year – TRINITY! From now until Advent (Dec. 2<sup>nd</sup>) we will be in the Trinity season, the color will be green, except for baptism Sundays and any feast days that fall on Sunday. As we begin the season of Trinity today we are ever mindful that our Anglican faith is based on our belief that there is one God, and that one God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The word *Trinity* does not appear in scripture, however, the reality that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is apparent in a number of scriptures, such as – Mt. 28:19 *Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.* Of course, the whole story of the Incarnation is that of God taking human form to come among us in the person of

Jesus. The Trinitarian belief is not easy to explain, and, for some, even harder to comprehend, how there can be three distinct entities, Father, Son & Holy Spirit, and yet these three are but one God. Sometimes we try to take everyday simple things and try to show how it can be made up of distinct principles but yet one thing. An apple consists of the peel, the flesh and the core, but yet a single apple. Water can be liquid, steam or ice, but still the same water. A Shamrock (which Roman Catholics like to use to illustrate the Trinity) is a young sprig, most have 3 leaves but yet still remains a single sprig. These examples may help to simplify it on a human level, but still they fall way short of explaining the mystery of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Some things, perhaps, are sufficient for us to accept on the basis of faith (*and faith is in large part the acceptance of that which we cannot see nor fully comprehend, but believe to be so*) I mentioned that our church calendar year comes full circle, a circle is also a symbol of the Trinity, in that it has neither a beginning nor an ending, the same as God the father, Son and Holy Spirit has always been and will always be. Another common symbol of the Trinity is a Triangle, that has three equal sides but still a single triangle. Suffice it for us to believe that God touches our lives in many ways, that he is in control, that he came to earth in the form of Jesus, and that at Pentecost he breathed his Holy Spirit upon

us. It was God's love being made manifest in our




